



Community Criteria for RNIP Program

Step 3: Once you've been deemed eligible based on [steps 1 and 2](#), the TEDC will prioritize applicants who are most likely to settle and reside in Timmins for the long-term and contribute to the local economy according to the Community Criteria. Applicants receive a score using the points-based system below. [As of January 20, 2021]

At the moment, **applicants need to achieve a total score of 65 or above** to be considered for recommendation. Note: As they are not considered priority occupations, applicants with a job offer in NOC 6211 and NOC 6311 need to achieve a total score of 75 or above to be considered for recommendation.

1. Applicant's age on the date the application is received	Points
Under 25 years old	0

2. Language proficiency	Points
a. Demonstrated language ability via Canadian Language Benchmark (CLB) or Niveaux de compétence linguistique canadiens (NCLC). Points given in each language category: reading, writing, speaking, and listening. CLB/NCLC of 6: 3 points One (1) additional point for each level above CLB/NCLC 6 to a total maximum of 20 points .	20
b. Additional language test submitted for other official language. Points given for minimum level across all four categories. CLB/NCLC 4: 6 points CLB/NCLC 5: 8 points CLB/NCLC 6 and above: 10 points	10

3. Work experience	Points
a. Applicants will receive points for accumulated full-time (at least 30 hours per week) relevant work experience: 1 year: 2 points 2 years: 3 points 3 years: 5 points 4 years and more: 7 points	7
b. Applicant will receive 8 points for one year full-time work experience in a priority NOC occupation listed in Step 2 and 12 points for two or more years (maximum 12 points).	12

4. Offer of employment	Points
*According to the Offer of Employment Form (IMM 5984)	
a. Applicant is currently working with the employer providing the job offer.	10
b. Offer of employment is in a priority NOC occupation listed in Step 2.	15
c. Occupation is a skill level 0, A, or B.	8
d. Job offer wage indicated exceeds \$17.00 per hour.	9
e. Employer is providing a workplace mentor for applicant (confirmed via a written letter from employer). Mentors and applicants should meet regularly (at least once a month) for at least one year after application.	10

5. Education	Points
a. Applicant graduated from a post-secondary institution in Timmins (minimum two-year diploma or degree).	10
b. Applicant has a graduate degree confirmed by an educational credential assessment (ECA) or from a Canadian institution. Examples include Masters, PhD, MD, etc.	3
c. Applicant has a qualification or certification related to the offer of employment and/or a priority NOC occupation as listed in Step 2. Examples include Red Seal, CHRP, etc.	7

6. Living in Timmins Applicants will be required to provide proof of residence (e.g. lease agreement, home purchase agreement, utility invoice, etc.) or visitation (e.g. tickets, hotel stays, etc.). Points from (a) may not be combined with (b) and (c). Points from (b) and (c) may be combined.	Points
a. Applicant is currently living in Timmins and has been (as of the date of application) for: Over 2 years: 14 points 1 year but less than 2 years: 10 points Over 6 months but less than 1 year: 4 points For international students who studied in Timmins, time period begins after graduation.	14
b. If not currently living in Timmins, applicant has previously lived in Timmins for a minimum of one (1) year within the past 10 years.	8
c. If not currently living in Timmins, applicant has previously visited Timmins for a minimum of 3 consecutive nights within the past 10 years. 2 points given per trip to a maximum of 6 points .	6

7. Family or friend in Timmins Applicant has an existing personal connection to a community member who is a permanent resident or Canadian citizen and who has been living in Timmins for a minimum of two years. The community member will need to provide a <u>signed</u> written reference letter stating the nature and length of the relationship.	Points
a. Immediate family connection Includes parents, siblings, or children. Maximum one connection for 10 points.	10
b. Extended family connection Includes grandparents, uncles, cousins, nieces, nephews. Maximum one connection for 6 points.	6
c. Close friend connection Friend must have no relation through blood, adoption, marriage or be your employer. Maximum two connections. Each connection will receive 2 points for a maximum of 4 points .	4
