



## Community Criteria for Timmins Regional RNIP

**Step 3:** Once you've been deemed eligible based on [steps 1 and 2](#), the TEDC will prioritize applicants who are most likely to settle and reside in Timmins and surrounding region for the long-term and contribute to the local economy according to the Community Criteria. Applicants receive a score using the points-based system below **[as of June 23, 2024]**.

At the moment, **applicants need to achieve a total score of 50 or above** to be considered for recommendation.

### Community Criteria

Points given in <b>each</b> language category: reading, writing, speaking, and listening.  CLB/NCLC of 6: <b>2 points</b> <b>One (1) additional point</b> for each level above CLB/NCLC 6 to a <b>total maximum of 15 points</b> .  If language test submitted is TEF Canada or TCF Canada, <b>13 additional points</b> given.	<b>28</b>
