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Community Criteria for Timmins Regional RNIP

Step 3: Once you've been deemed eligible based on <u>steps 1 and 2</u>, the TEDC will prioritize applicants who are most likely to settle and reside in Timmins and surrounding region for the long-term and contribute to the local economy according to the Community Criteria. Applicants receive a score using the points-based system below **[as of February 16, 2024]**.

At the moment, **applicants need to achieve a total score of 60 or above** to be considered for recommendation.
