Applications are assessed using the points-based system outlined below. Only <u>complete</u> applications will be placed in the Candidate Pool and be eligible for monthly draws for recommendation.

A complete application is one that meets the **minimum overall score of 50 points** by meeting the **minimum score of 10 points for** <u>each</u> eligibility factor: job offer, work experience, language, education, and intent to reside. The maximum score for a single eligibility factor is 25 points.

NOTE: **Sufficient proof must be provided in order to receive points**. Refer to Document Checklist for more information.
